

New Poll Finds Federal Workers More Popular Than Elon Musk

Survey finds that Musk is unpopular and Americans have serious concerns about his conflicts of interest and lack of accountability

WASHINGTON – *Tuesday, March 25, 2025* – Most American voters disapprove of Elon Musk, have a favorable view of federal workers, and think Musk is making major changes to the government without being accountable to voters. This is according to a new poll commissioned by Defending Democracy Together of 1,000 registered voters, conducted March 13 - 17. You can find toplines here.

The findings point to one clear conclusion: The American people don't like Elon Musk. Just two months into the second Trump administration, respondents believe Musk is making major changes to the government without being held accountable. And a majority said he bought his way into the administration.

- Federal employees are popular. Fifty-five percent of American voters hold favorable views of federal government employees, compared to 23 percent with unfavorable views.
- More Americans view Musk unfavorably than favorably, and people are split on DOGE. Forty percent hold a favorable view of Musk, while 50 percent view him unfavorably. DOGE is evenly split at 42 percent favorable versus 42 unfavorable.
- A plurality oppose Musk's actions and want him out of the government. Forty-six percent say they disagree with Musk's conduct in the administration and want him removed. Thirty-three percent approve, and 16 percent say they agree with his goals but are concerned he may go too far.
- Most are concerned that DOGE could use their personal information to hurt them. Fifty-seven percent are somewhat or very concerned that Social Security and IRS tax data could be leaked to hurt them. Forty-one percent say they are not too concerned.



 A substantial majority of Americans, including about a quarter of Trump voters, agree with statements critical of Musk. These include the statement that Musk is making major changes without being accountable to voters; that he has major conflicts of interest; and that he bought his way into his position.

"Elon Musk is not popular with the American people, and the federal workforce that he's gutting is," said Sarah Longwell, Executive Director of Defending Democracy Together. "His massive conflicts of interest, pay-to-play approach to politics, and careless disregard for millions of Americans' personal data are a huge red flag for people."

Note on Methodology: This national survey was commissioned by Defending Democracy Together and conducted by North Star Opinion Research from March 13 - 17, 2025, and consists of interviews with 1,000 registered voters, with a base of 800 interviews nationally, plus an oversample of 200 respondents who voted for Donald Trump in 2024, weighted to their appropriate proportion in the national electorate.

The survey used a mixed-mode methodology, with 20 percent live calls to landlines, 50 percent live calls to cell phones, and 30 percent text-to-web interviews. Calling quotas were set for gender, race, age, education, and state. The margin of error is ±3.10 percentage points.
